Background

Access to clean water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) is a fundamental human right, yet a large percentage of the world's population still lacks access to basic WASH facilities. Poor WASH conditions can lead to the spread of disease, environmental degradation, and economic loss. Therefore, it is essential to raise awareness and educate people on the importance of WASH, and how to adapt to the changing WASH scenarios in daily life. The workshop on the Adaptation of WATSAN and hygiene issues in daily life aims to create awareness among people about the importance of WASH, its adaptation to changing scenarios, and ways to maintain hygiene in daily life. The workshop will bring together experts from different fields to share their experiences and knowledge on WASH-related issues. The workshop will provide a platform for participants to learn about WASH technologies and practices, and how to apply them in their daily lives.

Objectives

The objectives of the workshop are as follows:

- To provide participants with the knowledge and skills required to maintain personal hygiene and prevent the spread of diseases.

- To provide a platform for participants to network with experts and peers, and share their experiences and best practices related to WASH.

Topics covered in the workshop are:

- Implementing sustainable sanitation practices in rural areas
- The impact of poor hygiene on public health and economic development
- Implementing WASH in Rohingya Camp, Bangladesh
- Promoting safe drinking water practices in disaster-affected areas
- Engaging community members in WATSAN and hygiene initiatives
- Understanding the role of government policies and funding in WATSAN and hygiene programs
- Innovations in WATSAN and hygiene technology and their practical application in daily life.
